



A Qualitative Study of Primary Care Physicians' Approaches to Caring for Adult Adopted Patients

Results from in-depth interviews with 23 primary care physicians (PCPs), exploring their training and approaches to caring for adopted adults with limited family medical history (LFMH)



Mental illness and trauma are under-recognized and under-addressed.



PCPs often obtain family medical history imprecisely, risking miscommunication and damage to the patient-physician relationship.



PCPs report knowledge gaps and receive little training or resources on adult adoptees with LFMH and want guidance around appropriate preventative screening and genetic testing.
